## **Calculations for Measures**

MEASURE	DESCRIPTION AND HOW IT WAS CALCULATED	
Graduation rate	Graduation rate is the percentage of a school's first-time, first-year undergraduate students who complete their program within 150% of the published time for the program. For example, for a four-year degree program, entering students who complete within six years are counted as graduates. So for a 36-credit masters designed for working adults taking one 3-credit course at a time, with six 8-week courses per year, the "published" time (even though one is not published) to complete is figured here to be 2 years. 150% of 2 years is 3 years.	
Job placement rate	As recommended by the National Association of Colleges and Employers, in lieu of the term "placement rate," these	

standards instead focus on the notion of a "career outcomes rate." This is described as the percentage of graduates who fall into the following categories<sup>1</sup>:

- Employed full time
- Employed part time
- Participating in a program of voluntary service
- Serving in the U.S. Armed Forces
- Enrolled in a program of continuing education
